SCIENCE – MS UNAU

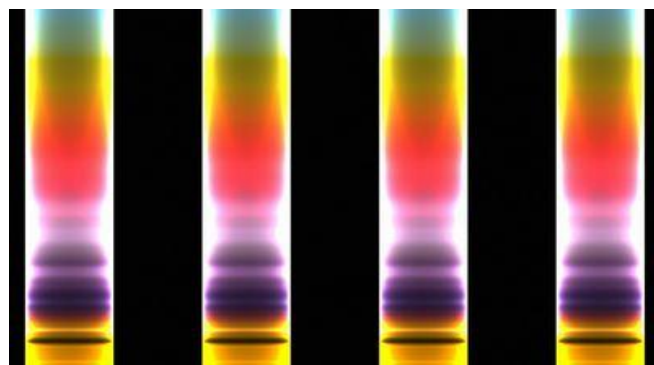
Year 10 have been testing the reactivity of metals.



They have learnt that metals below carbon in the reactivity series can be extracted using reduction and that metals above carbon need to be extracted using electrolysis. Year 10 have also learnt that electrolysis can be used to coat metals which is called electroplating.
