And 2 completed lamps from Roddick Class.

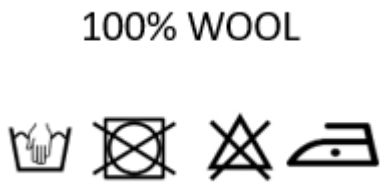

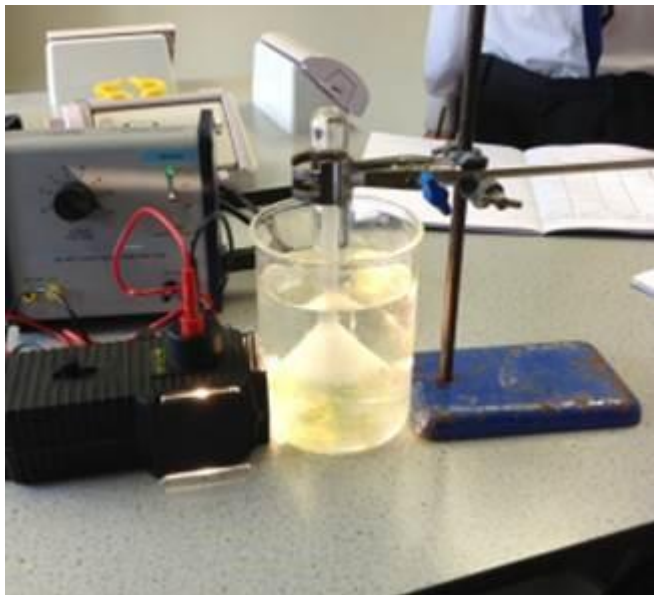


KS4 - SCIENCE

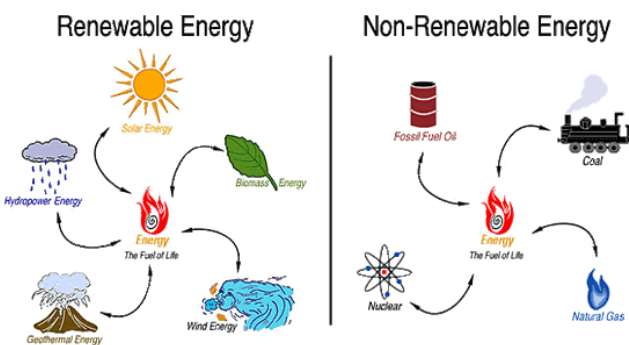
Year 9 have been learning about the science of cooking and cleaning. They have been learning how to read care labels in clothes as part of their Entry Level Science qualification.



Year 10 have been learning about photosynthesis and enzymes. They planned and carried out an investigation to see how changing the light intensity effects the rate of photosynthesis.

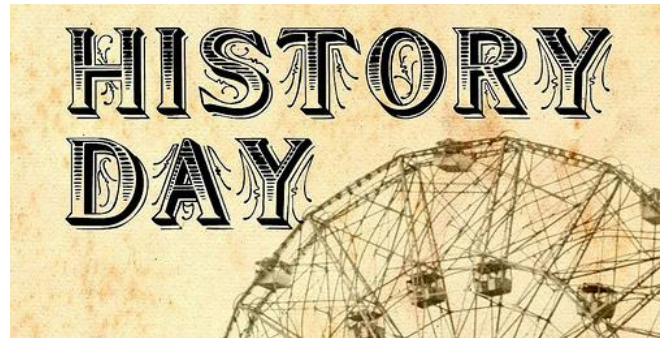


Year 11 have started their Physics module. They have been learning about renewable and non-renewable energy sources. They have been describing the energy transfers in a thermal power station.

We are delighted to be able to offer pupils at FHS another wonderful opportunity of learning to type without looking at the keys this Easter break - April 10th to the 14th.

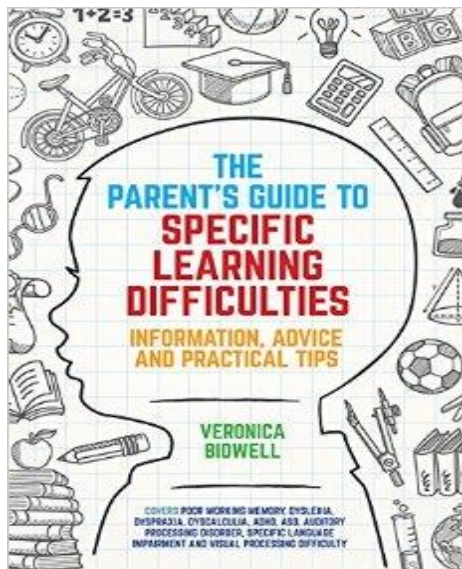
